13 High-touch, Deep Clean Areas in Guest Room

1 SWITCHES & IN-ROOM CONTROLS
Lights, lamps, switches and control panels

2 HANDLES & KNOBS
Doors, closets, drawers, furniture knobs and drapery pull handles

3 MAJOR BATHROOM SURFACES
Toilet seat, flush lever, splash walls, shower/ tub/ basin faucets

4 THERMOSTAT

5 TELEPHONES AND REMOTE CONTROLS
Handy phone, handsets, dial pads and function buttons

6 BED & BEDDING
All bed linens including duvet covers, pillowcases and sheets have been changed and treated at high temperatures to kill bacteria

7 BATH AMENITIES
Soap dispensers, individual toiletries, tissue boxes, soap dishes and amenity trays

8 HARD SURFACES
Tables, desks and bedside tables

9 CLOSET GOODS
Iron, hair dryer, safe handle and keypad

10 IN-ROOM FOOD AND BEVERAGE
Cutlery, glassware, ice buckets, mini bars, kettle and Nespresso coffee machine

11 FLOOR AREA & RUG
The floor has been thoroughly mopped. An aerosol germicide has also been sprayed on top of the rugs for disinfection purposes

12 IN-ROOM AIR QUALITY
Each room is equipped with individual air conditioning and ventilation system in which air will be pre-treated with UV light air purifiers to eliminate pollutants and bacteria. Fresh air intake and exhaust air outlets are also set 5 metres apart from each other to reduce the risk of cross-contamination

13 AIR PRESSURE
Negative air pressure is applied in all guest rooms as an isolation technique to prevent cross-contamination, as air will naturally flow from areas with higher pressure to areas with lower pressure, thereby preventing contaminated air from escaping the room
